## Installation

Failure to do so may cause serious damage to your monitor.

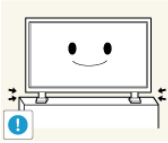

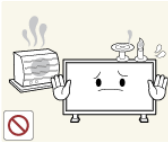

▶ When installing the product in a cabinet or rack, make sure that the front end of the bottom of the product does not project out.

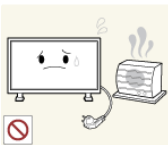

## Clean



When cleaning the monitor case or the surface of the TFT-LCD screen, wipe with a slightly moistened, soft cloth.



▶ Do not spray cleaner directly onto the surface of the product.

- Otherwise, this may result in the discoloration and distortion of the structure and the screen surface may peel off.



▶ When cleaning the power plug pins or dusting the power outlet, clean it with a dry cloth.

- Otherwise, it may result in fire.



▶ When cleaning the product, make sure to disconnect the power cord.

- Otherwise, it may result in electric shock or fire.



▶ When cleaning the product, disconnect the power cord and clean it with a soft, dry cloth.

- (Do not use chemicals such as wax, benzene, alcohol, thinner, mosquito repellent, lubricant, or cleaner.) These may change the appearance of the product surface and peel off the indication labels on the product.

- If you use the product in a location exposed to vibrations, it may damage the product and result in fire.



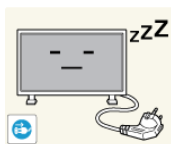
▶ When moving the product, turn the power off and disconnect the power plug, antenna cable, and all the cables connected to the product.

### Checking the Contents of the Package

## Your LCD Display

### Front



- 1 Remote Control Sensor

Aim the remote control towards this spot on the LCD Display.

- 2 Light sensor

Automatically detects the intensity of ambient light around a selected display and adjusts the screen brightness.

**3** Power indicator

Shows PowerSaver mode by blinking green



See PowerSaver described in the manual for further information regarding power saving functions. For energy conservation, turn your LCD Display OFF when it is not needed or when leaving it unattended for long periods.

**4** *POWER* button

Use this button for turning the LCD Display on and off.

**5** *SOURCE* button

Switches from PC mode to Video mode. Selects the input source that an external device is connected to.

[PC] → [DVI] → [AV] → [Component] → [HDMI1] → [HDMI2] → [DisplayPort] → [MagicInfo] → [TV]



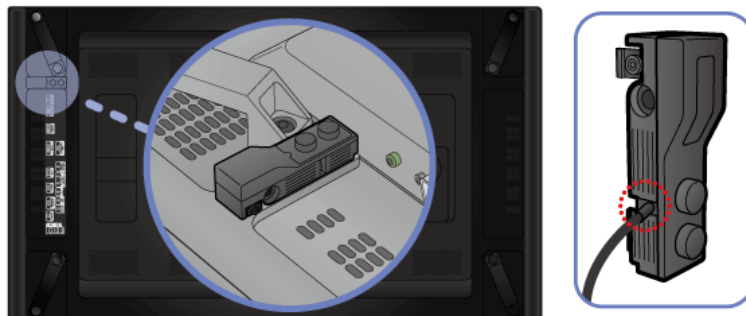
- A TV tuner box (sold separately) must be connected to use the TV.
- **MagicInfo** can only be enabled when a network box is connected.

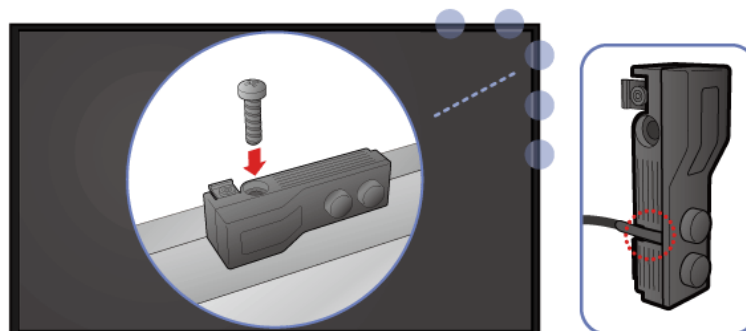
## Function knob

The function knob has a remote-control sensor, a light sensor and function keys. If mounting the display onto a wall, you can move the function knob to the side of the display.

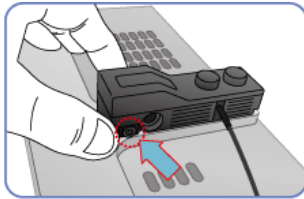
- The function knob can be attached to any screw hole on the display.
- Align the screw holes of the display and function knob. Next, fasten using the screw.



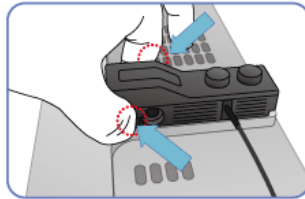

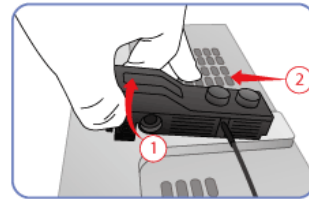
### Detaching the function knob

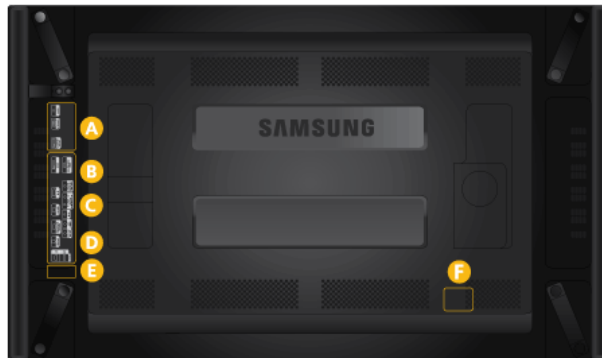

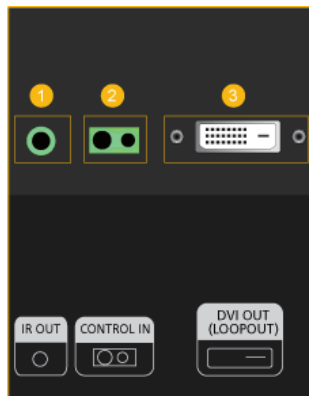

#### 1 IR OUT

Receives a signal from the remote control and outputs the signal through Loopout when a removable sensor board is connected.

#### 2 CONTROL IN

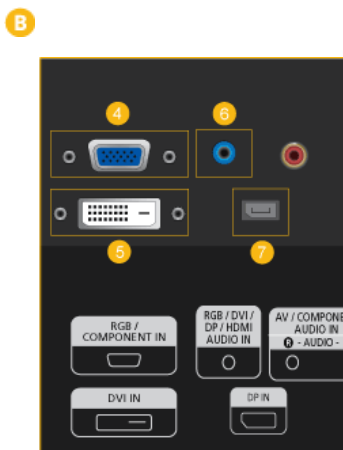
Connects to the function (Power/Source) control buttons and receives the light sensor signal and remote control's IR signal.

#### 3 DVI OUT (LOOPOUT)

- Connect a monitor to another monitor through a DVI, DVI to HDMI cable.
- Connect a DVI or DVI-HDMI cable to *[DVI OUT (LOOPOUT)]* on the product and *[DVI IN]* or *[HDMI IN]* on another monitor.
- HDMI and network signals sent via the *[DVI OUT (LOOPOUT)]* port are displayed on the second display which has the *[DVI IN]* port.

 **Note**

- The Loopout function can be used to duplicate the screen of the primary display. Connect *[DVI OUT]* on the primary display to *[DVI IN]* or *[HDMI]* on another display.
- A maximum of 100 monitors can be connected to DVI-Loopout (using a 2m-long DVI cable). Up to HD resolution can be supported. Compatible input sources include DVI IN, HDMI IN 1, and HDMI IN 2 (MagicInfo).
- The status of the cable may have a great effect on the Loopout performance.



**4** *RGB/COMPONENT IN (PC/COMPONENT Connection Terminal (Input))*

- Connect the *[RGB/COMPONENT IN]* port on the monitor to the RGB port on the PC using the D-SUB cable.
- Connect the *[RGB/COMPONENT IN]* port on the monitor to the COMPONENT port on the external device using the RGB to COMPONENT cable.
- Connect the *[RGB/COMPONENT IN]* port on the monitor to the BNC port on the PC using the RGB to BNC cable.

**5** *DVI IN (PC Video Connection Terminal)*

Connect the *[DVI IN]* port on the monitor to the DVI port on the PC using the DVI cable.

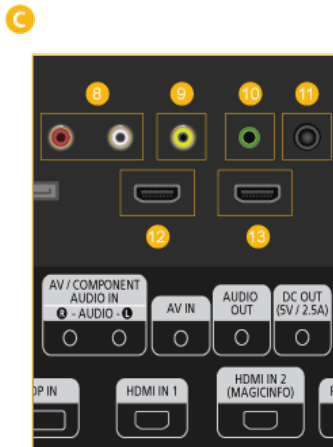
**6** *RGB/DVI/DP/HDMI AUDIO IN (PC/DVI/DP/HDMI Audio Connection Terminal (Input))*

Connect the *[RGB/DVI/DP/HDMI AUDIO IN]* terminal of the monitor and the speaker output terminal of your computer's sound card using a stereo cable (sold separately).

**7** *DP IN*

Receives a signal from the Display port.

Connect a DP cable to *[DP IN]* on the product and DP IN on another display.



**8** *AV/COMPONENT AUDIO IN [R-AUDIO-L]*

Connect the *[AV/COMPONENT AUDIO IN [R-AUDIO-L]]* port on the monitor to the audio output port on the PC or on the external device using an audio cable.

**9** *AV IN*

Connect the *[AV IN]* terminal of your monitor to the video output terminal of the external device using a VIDEO cable.

**10** *AUDIO OUT*

Connect a headphone or an External speaker.

**11** *DC OUT*

Make sure to use connecting *[DC OUT]* terminal to the authorized TV-Tuner Box[SBB\_DTC/ZA].



Otherwise, this may result in damage to the product.

**12** *HDMI IN 1*

- Connect the *[HDMI IN 1]* terminal at the back of your LCD Display to the HDMI terminal of your digital output device using a HDMI cable.
- Up to HDMI 1.3 can be supported.

 **Note**

- A normal external device (DVD player or camcorder, etc.) or a TV tuner box can be connected to the *[HDMI IN 1]* terminal.
- To use a TV tuner box, make sure to connect it to the *[HDMI IN 1]* terminal.

**13** *HDMI IN 2 (MAGICINFO)*

- Connect the *[HDMI IN 2 (MAGICINFO)]* terminal at the back of your LCD Display to the HDMI terminal of your digital output device using a HDMI cable.

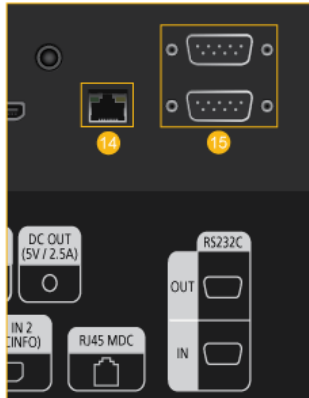


- Up to HDMI 1.3 can be supported.

 **Note**

The MAGICINFO OUT port must be connected to the [HDMI IN 2 (MAGICINFO)] port.

**14** *RJ 45 MDC (MDC PORT)*

MDC(Multiple Display Control) Program Port

Connect the LAN cable to [RJ45 MDC] on the product and LAN on the PC. To use an MDC, the MDC program must be installed on the PC.

 **Note**

Go to **Multi Control** and select **RJ45 MDC** as the **MDC Connection**.

**15** *RS232C OUT/IN (RS232C Serial PORT)*

MDC(Multiple Display Control) Program Port

Connect a serial cable (cross type) to [RS232C] on the product and RS232C on the PC. To use an MDC, the MDC program must be installed on the PC.

 **Note**

Go to **Multi Control** and select **RS232C MDC** as the **MDC Connection**.

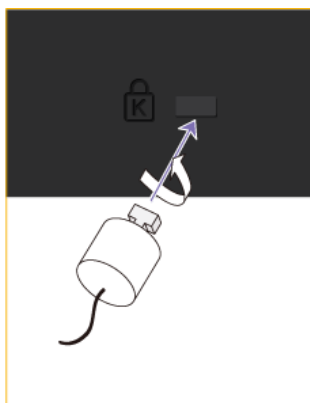
**16** *POWER S/W ON [—] / OFF*

Switches the LCD Display On/Off.

**17** *POWER*

The power cord plugs into the LCD Display and the wall outlet.

### *Kensington Lock slot*

An anti-theft lock allows you to use the product securely even in public places. The locking device shape and locking method depend on the manufacturer. Refer to the user guide provided with your anti-theft locking device for details.

### **To lock the product, follow these steps:**

1. Fix the cable of your anti-theft locking device to a heavy object such as a desk.
2. Put one end of the cable through the loop on the other end.
3. Insert the locking device into the anti-theft lock slot at the back of the product.
4. Lock the locking device.

### **Note**

- An anti-theft locking device can be purchased separately.
- Refer to the user guide provided with your anti-theft locking device for details.
- Anti-theft locking devices can be purchased at electronics retailers or online.

1 POWER

Turns the product On.

Electronic Program Guide (EPG) display.

Adjusts the audio volume.

6 SOURCE

Press the button to change the input signal SOURCE.

Changing the SOURCE is only allowed for external devices that are connected to the LCD Display at the time.

**7**  D.MENU

DTV menu display

- This function does not work for this LCD Display.


**8**  TOOLS

Use to quickly select frequently used functions.

- This function does not work for this LCD Display.

**9** Up-Down Left-Right buttons

Moves from one menu item to another horizontally, vertically or adjusts selected menu values.

**10**  INFO

Current picture information is displayed on the upper left corner of the screen.

**11** The Color button and the PC/DVI/HDMI/DP selection button

In TV mode, these buttons can be used for setting the broadcasting announcement function of a digital channel.

You can select the **PC**, **DVI**, **HDMI** or **DP(DisplayPort)** external input directly in a mode other than TV mode.

**12**  TTX/MIX

TV channels provide written information services via teletext.

- Teletext Buttons



- This is activated when a TV tuner box is installed.

**13** MTS/DUAL

You can select MTS (Multichannel Television Stereo) mode.

**14**  ENTER/PRE-CH

This button is used to return to the immediately previous channel.

- This is activated when a TV tuner box is installed.

**15**  MUTE

Pauses (mutes) the audio output temporarily. This is displayed on the lower left corner of the screen. The audio comes back on if MUTE or - VOL + is pressed in the Mute mode.

**16**  CH/P

In **TV** mode, selects TV channels.

- This is activated when a TV tuner box is installed.

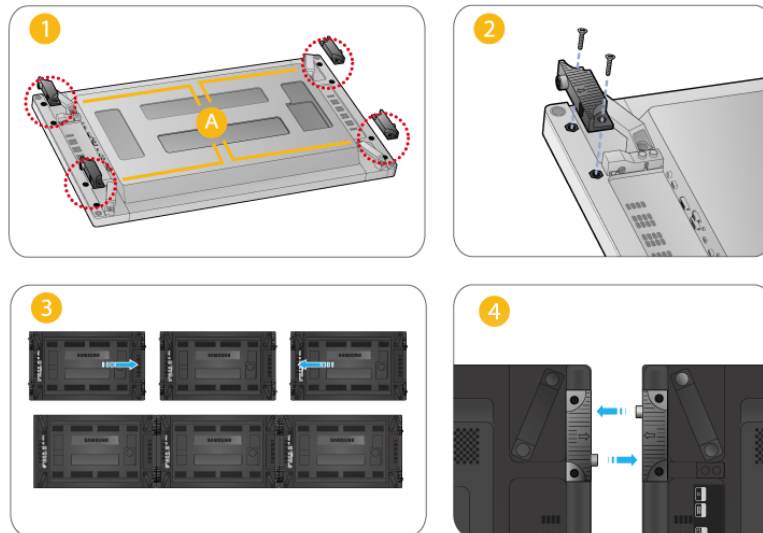

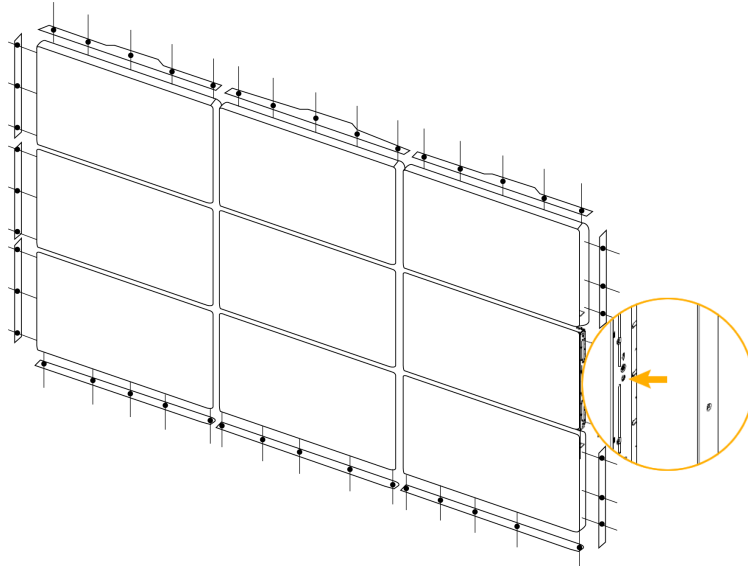
## Attaching the decoration brackets

- To attach the decoration brackets to a 3x3 video wall, ensure you connect all the displays before attaching the brackets.

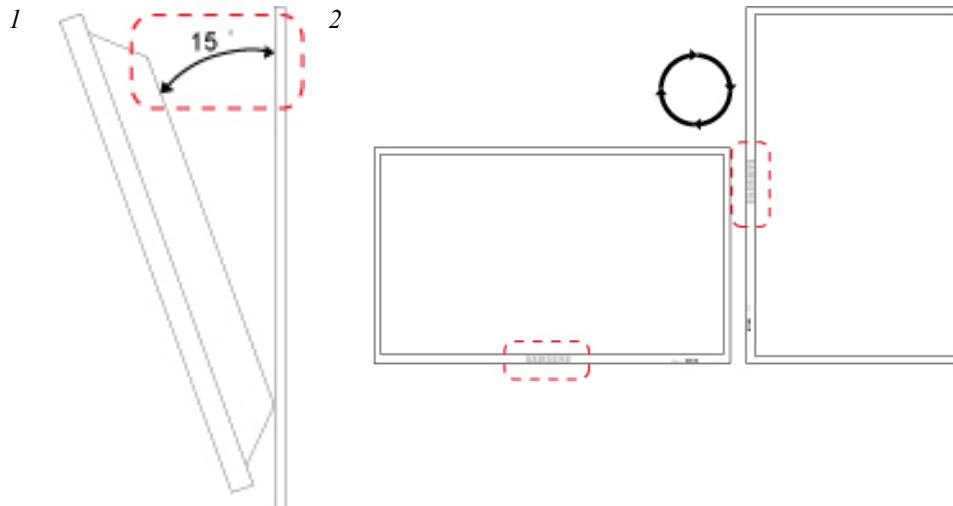

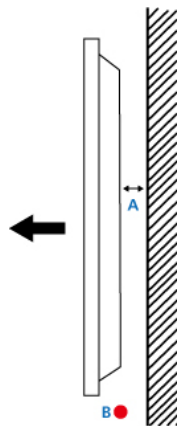

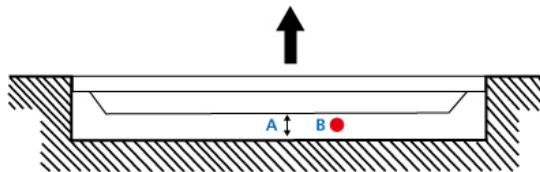

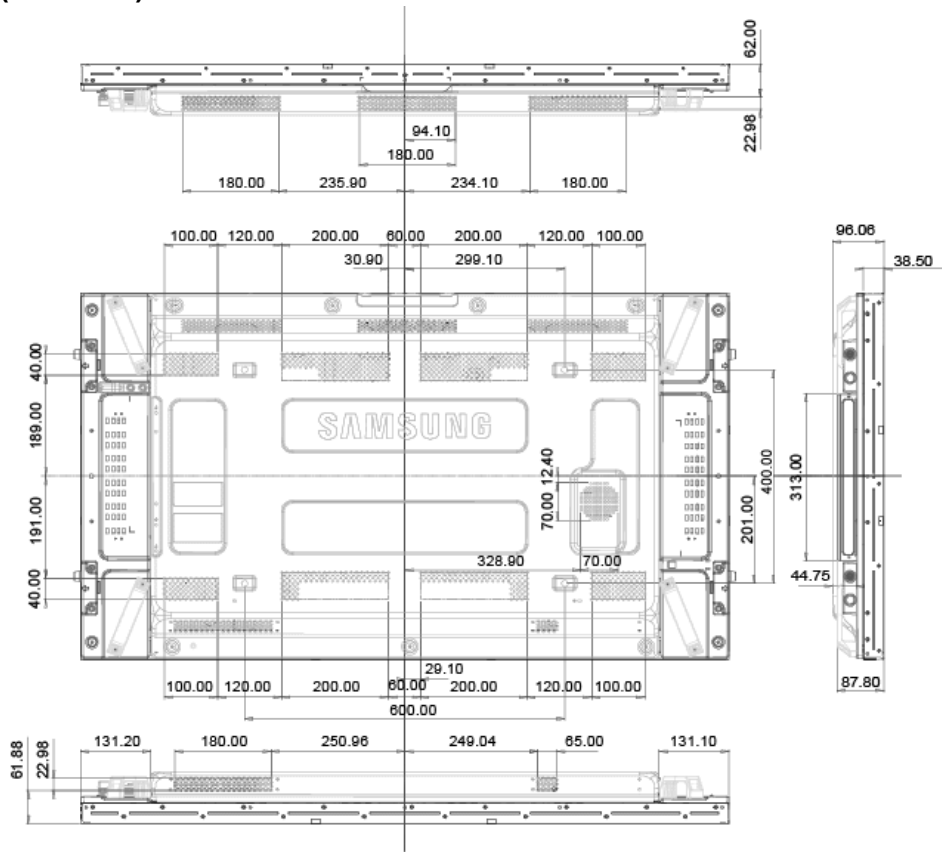

## Connecting a Computer

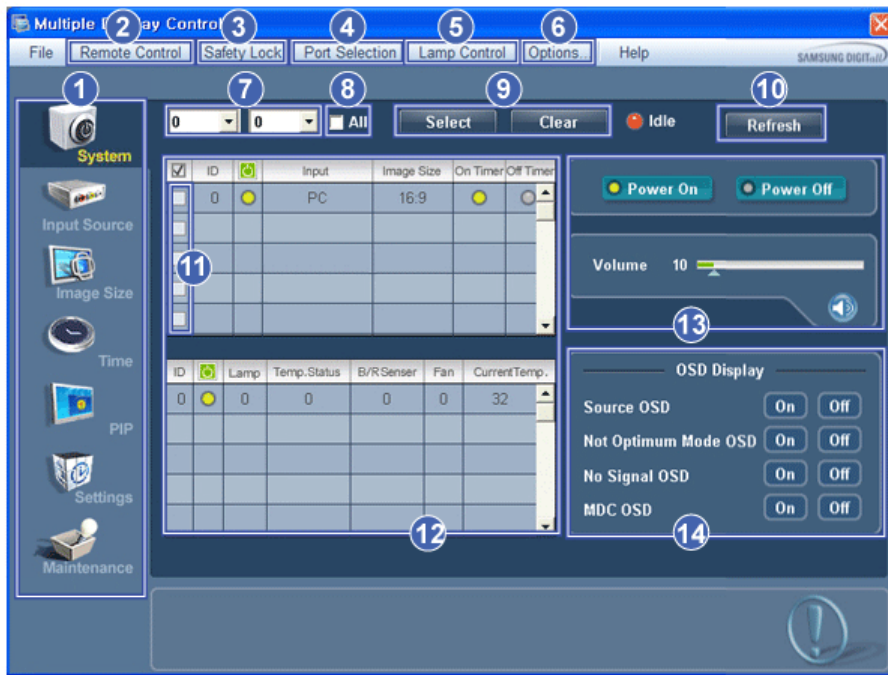


A Multiple Display Control (MDC) is an application allowing various displays to be easily and simultaneously operated on a PC. RS-232C, a standard of serial communication, is used for the communication between a PC and a display. Therefore, a serial cable should be connected between the serial port on a PC and the serial port on a display.

## Troubleshooting

- The display you wish to control does not appear on the System Info Grid
  - Check the connection of RS232C. (Check if it is properly connected to the Com1 port)
  - Check the displays to see if any of the other displays connected have the same ID. If more than one displays have the same ID, those displays are not properly detected by the program due to data conflict.
  - For monitors that support a Set ID between 0 to 99, you have to set the Set ID to a value between 0 and 99.

**Note :** Check if the Set ID of the monitor is a value between 0 and 99 (set the value using the Display menu).
- The display you wish to control does not appear on the other Control Info Grids
  - Check to see if the display power is ON. (You can check this in System Info Grid)
  - Check if you can change the input source of the display.
- The dialogue box appears repeatedly.
  - Check to see if the display you wish to control is selected.
- Both On Timer and Off Timer have been set but different time is showing.
  - Apply current time to synchronize the display clocks.

  - For monitors that support a Set ID between 0 to 99, you have to set the Set ID to a value between 0 and 99.

- The display you wish to control does not appear on the other Control Info Grids
  - Check to see if the display power is ON. (You can check this in System Info Grid)

2. Unplug the video cable from the back of the computer.
3. Turn on the LCD Display.

The figure shown below ("**No Signal**") appears on a black background when the LCD Display is working normally even though no video signal is detected: While in the Self-Test mode, the LED power indicator remains green and the figure moves around on the screen.

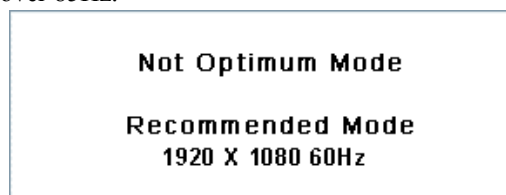


4. Turn off your LCD Display and reconnect the video cable; then turn on both your computer and the LCD Display

If your LCD Display screen remains blank after using the previous procedure, check your video controller and computer system; your LCD Display is functioning properly.

## Warning Messages

You can even view the screen at a resolution of 1920 x 1080. However, you will receive the following message for a minute; You can choose to change the screen resolution or stay in the current mode during that time. If the resolution is more than 85Hz, you will see the black screen because the LCD Display does not support over 85Hz.

## Symptoms and Recommended Actions



### Note

A LCD Display recreates visual signals received from the computer. Therefore, if there is a problem with the computer or the video card, this can cause the LCD Display to become blank, have poor coloring, become noisy, etc. In this case, first check the source of the problem, and then contact a Service Center or your dealer.

1. Check if the power cord and the video cables are properly connected to the computer.
2. Check if the computer beeps more than 3 times when booting.  
(If it does, request service.)
3. If you installed a new video card or if you assembled the PC, check if you installed the Adaptor (video).
4. Check if the scanning ratio of the video screen is set to between 50 Hz ~ 85 Hz.  
(Do not exceed 60Hz when using the maximum resolution.)
5. If you have problems in installing the Adaptor (video) driver, boot the computer in Safe Mode, remove the Display Adaptor in the "Control Panel -> System -> Device Administrator" and then reboot the computer to reinstall the Adaptor (video) driver.

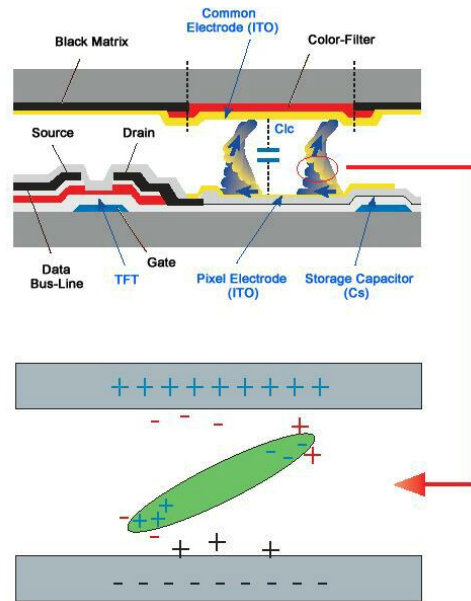

Normal conditions are defined as continuously changing video patterns. The voltage difference between electrodes increases with time, forcing the liquid crystal to lean. When this occurs, the previous image may be seen when the pattern is changed. 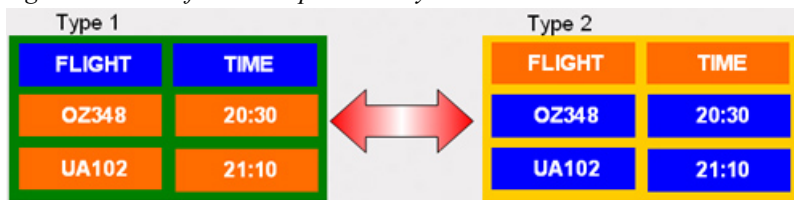

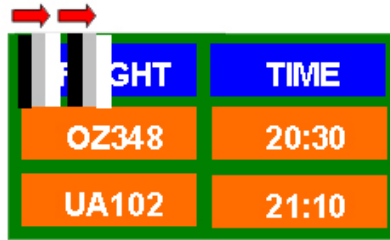

**Terms**

Dot Pitch	The image on a monitor is composed of red, green and blue dots. The closer the dots, the higher the resolution. The distance between two dots of the same color is called the 'Dot Pitch'. Unit: mm
Vertical Frequency	The screen must be redrawn several times per second in order to create and display an image for the user. The frequency of this repetition per second is called the Vertical Frequency or Refresh Rate. Unit: Hz  Example: If the same light repeats itself 60 times per second, this is regarded as 60 Hz.
Horizontal Frequency	The time to scan one line connecting the right edge to the left edge of the screen horizontally is called the Horizontal Cycle. The inverse number of the Horizontal Cycle is called Horizontal Frequency. Unit: kHz
Interlace and Non-Interlace Methods	Showing the horizontal lines of the screen from the top to the bottom sequentially is called the Non-Interlace method while showing odd lines and then even lines in turn is called the Interlace method. The Non-Interlace method is used for the majority of monitors to ensure a clear image. The Interlace method is the same as that used in TVs.
Plug & Play	This is a function that provides the best quality screen for the user by allowing the computer and the monitor to exchange information automatically. This monitor follows the international standard VESA DDC for the Plug & Play function.
Resolution	The number of horizontal and vertical dots used to compose the screen image is called the 'resolution'. This number shows the accuracy of the display. A high resolution is good for performing multiple tasks as more image information can be shown on the screen.  Example: If the resolution is 1920 x 1080, this means the screen is composed of 1920 horizontal dots (horizontal resolution) and 1080 vertical lines (vertical resolution).
